"Ultimately we want everyone to understand the concept of supported living and what we can provide, and forging links with the community is the best way to do this."

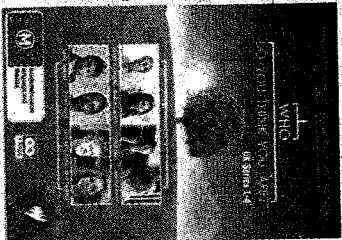
